

Ask for Angie/Andy Pupils' Competition

Teacher Guidance

1. Objective

Keeping Children Safe In Education, KCSIE, requires a pro-active approach to safety, bullying, abuse, homophobia, grooming, etc., be it in-school or out.

This project is designed to get KS3 pupils involved and to help to address the requirement for a pro-active approach.

The competition is open to individuals and teams of girls, boys or mixed at Key Stage 3 (12 to 14 years of age) in Coventry, Banbury and Wwarwickshire.

The winning team will each receive a BBC Micro:bit Inventors Kit.



For instance, whilst the installation of a "bully box" is pro-active, however, once installed its use is reactive.

The intimidation may be in-school, out-of-school, face-to-face, internet, or behind their back, to the pupil or to a pupil's friend who should be helped.

This concept is based upon the original Ask for Angela mechanism, aimed at ladies in pubs, night clubs, etc. and started by Lincolnshire County Council, has spread country-wide. We have the approval of the Substance Misuse and Sexual Violence & Abuse Strategy Coordinator for Lincolnshire for this project. They wish to be made aware of the outcome.

2. Design

Posters	One for girls. One for boys.
Size	A4 to A0 size, portrait or landscape.
Margins	1cm top, bottom, right and left.
Ask for Angie/Andy	Top of poster.
Angie/Andy	Pupils may choose the names, however Angie/Andy are preferred as they link to the original scheme launched by Lincolnshire County Council.
School Name	Top of poster. Any font.
Contacts	Bottom of poster. Any font. Angie is (space for name of staff member). Andy is (space for name of staff member). Anonymous: Please email (email address) or call (phone number + extension) (a dedicated number is suggested, e.g. dedicated mobile)
Boxes	Pupil's choice.
Main section layout	Pupil's choice.
Animation	Pupil's choice, may be manual, mechanical, electrical, electronic, software, or any combination. Points are given for each type of animation. Manual: e.g. handles, levers, motion,

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Electrical: e.g. motors, relays, switches,
 Electronic: e.g. sensors, transistors, gates, computers,
 Software: e.g. scratch, python, c.

Colours	Pupil's choice of text colours. Pupil's choice of background colours.
Fonts	Pupil's choice
Graphics	Pupil's choice.
Resolution	Good resolution when enlarged to A0 size. e.g. 300dpi minimum (this is usually the function of the printer, not the document).
Confidentiality	The following must be displayed on the poster: "Details of contacts made to Angie/Andy shall be confidential and follow school pupil safeguarding best practice."
Teams	Individuals and teams of up to four pupils may enter. Teams may be single sex or of both sexes.
Age of Pupils	The competition is open to individuals and teams of girls, boys or mixed at Key Stage 3 (12 to 14 years of age).
Plagiarism	Copyrighted and registered graphics, logos, names, etc, may not be used without the documented agreement of the owner. Free use is usually permitted by suppliers of clip-art.
Submission	PDF or photograph format, animated entries may also submit a video in mpg format. Note that videos exceeding 25Mb cannot normally be sent by email. They may be submitted by post on memory cards.

5. Prizes

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Pupil Guidance

1. Objective

Ask for Angie/Andy is a competition for KS3 pupils to design a poster suggesting that pupils who are being intimidated should contact a named member of school staff who would give advice and take action to stop the intimidation.

The winning team at the final, held just before the Easter break, will each receive a BBC Micro:bit Inventors Kit.



An original mechanism was launched by Lincolnshire County Council called Ask for Angela, aimed at ladies in pubs and clubs who were experiencing unwanted attention. The idea has spread across the UK.

The competition is open to individuals and teams of girls, boys or mixed at Key Stage 3 (12 to 14 years of age).

Equal points will be given for Art-Design, Innovation, Animation and Impact (getting the message across).

There may be separate posters for girls (Ask for Angie) and boys (Ask for Andy).

The intimidation may be in-school, out-of-school, face-to-face, internet, or behind your back, to yourself or to a friend who should be helped.

Types of intimidation, for example, could be bullying, bad-mouthing, unwarranted criticism, threats, safety, abuse, homophobia, grooming.

Each school will nominate two posters to be entered into the final to be held in the week beginning 19th. March 2018. Entries for the final must be submitted after 11th. February and before 3rd. March 2018. The original posters should be brought to the final to be exhibited.

Initially the poster should be submitted in PDF form and also in MPG format showing the animation.

Ask for Angie/Andy - KCSIE Pupils' Competition

Keeping Children Safe In Education requires a proactive approach which may be missing in some schools.

Ask for Angela is an approach launched by Lincolnshire County Council which has gone UK wide.

This competition mimics the Ask for Angela approach but should address both girls and boys



Many schools have a "Bully Box" in place, however once installed this becomes a reactive mechanism. OFSTED have criticised some schools for not being pro-active.

Some schools do not realise that their responsibilities do not cease once the pupil is outside school.

There are too many examples of intimidation outside school, often on social networks.

This competition is for KS3 pupils, alone or in teams, to create an automated poster so involving KCSIE and STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering Arts and Maths) and which seeks to address areas of the curriculum similar to the Ask For Angela idea. Teams may be single sex or mixed.

The project has the good wishes of Lincolnshire Council. It is being piloted in Coventry, Banbury and Warwickshire. Each school will be invited to send their winning entries to a final in Coventry in March 2018, before the Easter break.
